



Dear league organizers:

I want to first express how much our team hopes you and your loved ones are all safe and happy in these ever-changing times. Honestly, I have as many questions as you and your groups. We do not know where this health crisis is going and how it will affect the start of league play or if we will even be able to stay open. I can say with no hesitation that no one is fighting for the opportunity to provide our golfers the opportunity to play than our team.

Your safety and the safety of our staff is our top priority. We will not challenge any recommendations from the CDC, local health districts and our legislators. These leaders are the experts in public health. See the bullet points below for our current status.

- We are still open for play as of 3/24/20.
- Starting on 3/24/20 we are restricted from allowing golf cart usage. We can only allow walking play based on the most recent Executive Order from Governor Beshear.
- We hope to limit as much guest/staff interaction as possible by encouraging paying in advance for rounds. We have many options to do so and can talk through each group for their individual needs.
- We only allow two guests in the clubhouse at a time and would like to limit that even more as much as possible.
- We can only sell prepackaged food products like chips, crackers, soda, water. Currently we cannot sell alcohol to be consumed on property per the closing of establishments with our licensing limitations.
- Sanitizing frequently and practicing all CDC recommendations has allowed us to remain open and we appreciate your patience and understanding as we try to keep your groups and our staff safe. I can walk through all our safety measures with anyone who would like more detail.

After reading above, please discuss with your groups about how you would like to proceed and let me know what I can do to get you started as soon as possible. Keep in mind your players, where they fit in regarding age, health and any other factors that may make them more susceptible. I would love all leagues to start on their start date but understand that there are many factors that may influence a delay. Ability to walk versus ride, health risks, and quite frankly we may or may not be allowed to be open. All league times are safe no matter when we start. Please work with our Assistant GM, Greg Dooley to walk through any start date changes. Please reach out to me directly with at any time for additional clarity as well. Your groups are the foundation of our business and we will work tirelessly to make 2020 the best season it can be.

I wish I had more answers than questions, but I also pride myself on being honest and an open book. We are all in this together as a community. Thank you and again, please be safe.
